**How we spent our Pupil Premium in 2013/2014**

**Actions focussed on learning in the curriculum:**

Small group teaching in Year 6 (Maths and Literacy sets)  
 Homework club  
 HLTA delivering high quality interventions  
 Intervention Training and Resources  
 1:1 Tuition  
 Reading lunchtime and afterschool clubs including Kindle club  
 Trips linked to the curriculum subsidised, residential in year 3, 4, 5, and 6. Visit from an author.  
 Extra staff member in each reception class to accelerate learning  
 Specialist equipment to support learning i.e. Archery  
 Transition programmes for children moving to Nursery, Reception and Secondary school  
 Personalised transition programmes for children requiring this.

**Actions focussed on SEBD**

Healthy Eating afterschool club  
 Family Support: Provides nurture programme, social skills training, supports children in crisis, offers bereavement counselling, behaviour support and anger management work  
 Exceed LAP activity- children meet other children.  
 Linking Schools  
 Attendance challenge and reward scheme  
 New arrivals Co-ordinator

**Actions focussed on enrichment beyond the curriculum**

Breakfast club and After school clubs (wide variety are free, others subsidised)  
 Free books given to all nursery children to encourage reading at home  
 Story sacks borrowing scheme runs in Nursery  
 Outdoor Education Provided to KS2 (free of Charge)  
 IPC Visits included within Curriculum

**Actions focussed on families and communities**

Courses run by school staff in conjunction with the Children's Centre  
 Nursery teacher release time to carry out home visits  
 Parental Involvement support worker  
 Family Support Workers  
 Community Learning Manager  
 SLT attend CAF and LAC meetings to support families in difficulty  
 Meetings about SATS, Transition, Phonics,

### Impact of Pupil Premium

- Accelerated learning of vulnerable/targeted groups of pupils
- Reduction in families needing Family Support provision, benefits advice and involvement of other agencies
- Children feel that they achieve well and respond well to challenges when asked in pupil interviews
- Removal of barriers to learning for pupils
- Pupils supported in extended learning beyond the curriculum
- Parents provided with support to help engage in their children's learning and equipping them with the knowledge and skills to do this effectively.
- Children who arrive with little or no prior experience of English made rapid progress in their learning.

### Future Plans and Proposals

Continue as detailed above and in addition added provision detailed below:

- Develop intervention programmes to improve achievement in English
- Continue to train staff in intervention programmes to ensure high quality delivery of catch up programmes.
- Allocate funding to breakfast club, to promote engagement before school

### Why it is important to claim your Free School Meals

**The additional funding for children on free school meals is increasing. It will help to support the learning and achievement of your child. Please apply for free school meals if you are eligible.**

Parent/guardian must get one of the following:

- Child Tax Credit, (but **not** Working Tax Credit) and have an annual income (as assessed by HM Revenue & Customs) that does not exceed **£16,190**
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 (for this, you will need to apply directly to the school, NOT to Bradford Council).

\*Where a parent is entitled to Working Tax Credit in the 4-week period immediately after their employment stops, or after they start to work less than 16 hours per week, their children are entitled to free school meals for this period.
